- Alternate solutions






Visual Impacts




Noise

- Implement notification protocol




Vibration

Study Finding: Measured vibration levels were below levels which could potentially damage structures

Safety

Community Perception: Safety a key theme in survey responses **Actions**:

- "Traditional" avalanche methods no longer considered viable
- Continue Gazex operations
- Ongoing operational improvements

Notification Protocol



Squaw Valley Alpine Meadows will notify you when the Gazex avalanche control system will be used for avalanche control work on Alpine Meadows Road.

Sign up for Alpine Meadows Avalanche Control Notifications

- Register for Placer-Alert, Placer County's mass notification system
- Contact Placer County Office of Emergency Services (OES) and asked to be added to the Alpine Meadows Avalanche Control Notification list
 - PlacerOES@placer.ca.gov or 530-886-5300
- Provide your name and phone number associated with your Placer-Alert account
- 3. OES will contact you with confirmation that you were added to the list
- If at any point you wish to "opt-out" of the alerts, please contact Placer County OES

Avalanche control notifications you may receive: may receive: phone call

- Avalanche control work on Alpine Meadows Road;
 Gazex use tomorrow is possible.
- Avalanche control work on Alpine Meadows Road;
 Gazex use within two hours, Alpine Meadows Road closure is imminent.
- Avalanche control work on Alpine Meadows Road;
 Gazex use is possible today, at any time.
- 4. Avalanche control work on Alpine Meadows Road; Gazex use is complete, Alpine Meadows Road is now open.

How to Register for Placer-Alert

- 1. Visit www.Placer-Alert.org.
- Click Sign up to enter your user profile information, then click Create Your Account.

3. My Profile

- · Verify your first and last name.
- Enter the phone numbers or email addresses for alerts.
 You do not have to enter something in every box. For example, if you only have one cell phone then you would put that number in the Primary Cell Phone field and leave the Secondary Cell Phone field blank.
- Click Save & Continue.

4. My Location

- You are able to enter alert requests for up to five separate locations (home, work, school, parent's house, etc.).
- After each entry, you must click Verify this Address so the system can geo-locate the address.
- Confirm the location on the map is correct, then click
 This is my Location to proceed.
- Click Save & Continue.

5. My Subscriptions

- Emergency Alerts are included by default. To receive additional notifications, review the subscription lists and check the appropriate boxes.
- Click Save & Continue.

6. Review

- · Review your information for accuracy.
- You can send a test notification to your contact methods
- . Check the "I'm not a robot" box, then click Finish.







Additional Feedback

- Evening/Nighttime Gazex deployment only when determined necessary. Squaw (contractor) will take necessary steps for securing emergency agency lead before deployed (as they did last year). Contract between Squaw and County will be updated to clearly articulate process to be followed.
- Environmental review of 8 Gazex units determined exempt based on use in other resort areas and improved safety.
 Because of known community concerns, future proposed units to include public comment.
- Additional studies/monitoring not being recommended at this time– below OSHA or other applicable standards. One purpose of notification system is to allow reasonable time to vacate area prior to Gazex deployment.
- Non-personnel control methods open to discussion about future alternatives, financed by local community.
